This year we welcomed one new member, Emma Wallace. Emma quickly became a positive asset to our team and was responsible for organizing and executing the inaugural OLA Sports Carnival raffle, which was a great success. Continuing members were myself as President, Lina Brunini as Vice President, Ann-Maree Barbaro as Secretary, Katie Catena as Treasurer & Magda Bartuciotto as our Communications & Marketing Executive Member. Each one of these ladies continue to go above and beyond their roles, offering their spare time to the cause with enthusiasm, dedication and a great sense of humour.

Our fundraising efforts this year involved a series of events that continue to prove successful thanks to the involvement & generosity of our school community. The OLA Footy Tipping, Easter Raffle & Cookie Drive & School Disco will continue to remain annually anticipated events on our calendar.

The Story Slam & Colour Run were both repeated this year, again with a positive response from both parents and students although no-one had more fun at the colour run than Snoopy did! Our thanks to Cath McGrath for again coordinating the Footy Tipping, as well as the Year 5 parents for organizing another fun school disco for the students. A big thankyou also to the staff for accommodating and assisting with the P&F events throughout the year both big and small.

Back in 2020, the P&F committed to a \$75,000 donation for the refurbishment of the Science Lab & School Library. In my 3 years as President, our efforts have been primarily focused on the fundraising required to achieve this goal and it gives us great pleasure to report that the final payment of \$30,000 for this donation was made to the school earlier this year. Our fundraising has ensured that the P&F remain in a strong financial position to be able to give back to the school to benefit our students, staff and the wider community.

In addition to the above commitment, the P&F has also provided the following resources to the school this year: \$5,000 for decodable readers which were distributed to the Pre-Primary to Year 3 classrooms in Term 1, \$5,000 for new Interschool Jerseys and \$900 for a new school camera. These are in addition to our annual contributions to the 2 Wellness Weeks & the Year 6 Graduation books.

At the end of 2023 Lina will be stepping down from her role as Vice President. Lina has been a

member of the P&F since 2021 and has held the VP role for the past 2 years. She was instrumental in the planning of the school fete back in 2021 as well as the inaugural Colour Run last year. I will also be stepping down at the end of the year. I joined the P&F as Secretary in 2019 And have spent the last 3 years as President. I have enjoyed the role immensely, which has been made all the better by the wonderful people I have had the pleasure of working with.
